

AOPA Buchanan Fiel d RFP Update

Wondering what ever happened to the RFP to redevelop Buchanan Field? Well, Tuesday, March 15th is the appointed date for the County Comunity Development department to announce their findings concerning the one and only proposal submitted. However, inside sources have it that rather than announcing any decision, the county will be asking for an extension of time for their review. Why? Because the developer in question hasn't yet made all the required submissions to get the process started.

Since there has been essentially no progress in the evaluation process since this issue was last visited by the Board of Supervisors, you might wonder why any further time and money should be spent on it at all and AOPA California Rep John Pfeifer will be on hand Tuesday to make just that point. This is a very important meeting and all pilots and other airport advocates are urged to attend the meeting and make their feelings known. Meeting time is 9 am in the Supervisors Chambers, Martinez.

Master Pl an Update Kickoff

Later in the day on Tuesday, the Buchanan Field Master Plan Steering Committee will meet with the chosen consultant Bernard Dunkelberg of Tulsa, Oklahoma to kick off the update of this important document. Much effort was put into choosing a consultant that was independent of the RFP evaluation process. Pilots are well represented in this process by people such as Richard Roberts representing MDPA, Dave Evans and John Pfeifer representing AOPA, Russ Roe prepresenting the AAC etc. More information will be forthcoming as this process gets underway and there will be many opportunities for public input and comment.
