MDPA SAFETY CLINIC-Held May '08

This month's session was sobered by the recent loss of one of our own, Dave Cunningham, in a float plane accident in the Sierras.

For this session we addressed the importance of setting the altimeter to our new location. In the story we addressed, the issue was the correction of the altimeter of .05 inches that would have made the difference of life or death. Death was the outcome of two experienced

pilots flying into a tower in Southern California in VFR, day conditions. Glare was a major factor, but the two items either of which could have saved them was:

- 1. To have been at pattern altitude for the destination airport, which they were not at due to not having reset the altimeter, and
- 2. Apparently not having the charted tower information in their minds.


It is almost inconceivable in the day of GPS that we would not have such hazards readily portrayed, but useful only if we are looking at it, given that we could not see out the window. Of course the old Mark 1 Mod 0 sectional works.

BTW, I had a thought when I read this last Time Magazine's "100 most Influential People of the World" and noted that a surgeon had developed a unique device that had resulted in the reduction of hospital acquired infection that occurs in ICUs with 1 out of 10 patients. After applying this "new device," infections dropped from 2.7/1000 to 0 in the evaluation case. Yes -----the "**new** device" was a ------**checklist**.

My wife, Jude, took the opportunity to join us for breakfast this time and offered her own "passenger" experiences of harrowing moments and how they had come about. She was pretty expressive and I didn't have much to say. She did comment later that it was good that only pilots attended these sessions after she heard our bantering about accidents.

One of the pilots mentioned "Funny Farm", a strip in the Delta with power lines that get snapped by unsuspecting aircraft trying to land. I could not find it on the chart. Any clues?




