- -Discussed the importance of the PIREP program using the enroute Flight Watch frequency, 122.0 KHz. Very important to pilots that are coming along your same route.
- -Announced the upcoming Airport BBQ on Thursday, 5/1/14 starting at 11:00.
- -Asked randomly what the "Movement Area" was at the airport----many did not know that term, even the newer pilots-in-training. In short, it is the "Federal" part of the airport, i.e. runways and taxiways.

- -Talked about the umbrella organizations for charity flights, the Air Care Alliance. Commented that it was a good place to start finding out about the various affiliated organizations.
- -Pointed out that the AOPA ASN (Airport Support Network) was identified on the AOPA CCR airport site as members of the county airport staff. Normally this is not the case since most are not employees of the airport but rather aviation community volunteers.





### MDPA Meeting and Dinner, 18 April 2014

The April dinner was co-hosted by Tony Tiritilli, Elaine Yeary, Marielle Moyer, and Maureen Bell. Tony provided lasagna, Elaine brought bring green salad, Marielle brought bread, and Maureen supplied cheesecake for dessert.

The speaker for the meeting was Leonard Slape. His spoke about CPR, first aid, and post-crash survival strategies. He emphasized that preparedness is the key to a successful rescue, and discussed equipment that he believes is beneficial to carry in an aircraft.

Considering the risks inherent in aviation, education on this topic is particularly important to all of us. Leonard joined the aviation community in 1996 as an A&P mechanic, and has worked for United Airlines since 1999. He held an EMT license for 10 years, and currently holds a Medical Assistant certification. He taught CPR/First Aid with the Red Cross for 16 years, taught CPR/First Aid for United for several years, and part of his current duties for United involve instruction in confined space entry and rescue.
