#### SAFETY FORUM Moderator – Marc Ausman

Although Marc had recently sold his plane due to work demands, he nevertheless made a special effort to be the Moderator for this session. He recounted several events about safety issues found during pre-flight. The first was when, early in his flying career, he unknowingly returned an aircraft with only ½ gallon remaining due to a "minor" fuel leak. The lesson learned was about things that seem small can be amplified while in the air.

The next incident was when he noticed during a preflight that bugs



had indeed plugged the pitot tube and he had a passenger who insisted that the flight proceed as planned. This was after a leaking fuel line had to be replaced. Marc reported that he refused to fly the aircraft amidst some choice words from the passenger, also a pilot, who went ahead and used the airplane on his own against Marc's judgment. Purportedly he arrived successfully at his destination.

The last was a circumstance in a twin where the pilot was interrupted during a preflight inspection and a fuel cap was not put in place and thereafter the mistake was noticed as the aircraft took off and began the climb out. Fuel was streaming from the wing and the pilot returned to land safely, after being told about the leak by the tower. The lesson here
