#### SAFETY FORUM

#### <u>Moderator – Leslie Adams</u>

Leslie brought to the table thoughts on her personal experiences as a pilot. Most of her hours have been in rental C-172s out of Livermore and also now Concord.

She posed the first question along with an observation---most pilots after licensing don't do a weight and balance before flight. She noted that many are so familiar with their aircraft that they do not consider it necessary and take for granted that they know the maximum allowances of their airplane.

She told of her experience at Columbia which is at a higher elevation and taking off with a full load and partial fuel on a hot day and the anxiety of getting airborne. Add to that the voices of the passengers urging her to proceed made it difficult for this low-time pilot to practice what she'd been taught.

In many cases shared by the pilots "get there it-is" played a role in many trips and was often a very large factor in whether to proceed with the flight or not. Of course that leads to the compounding of heightened anxiety.

In another case out of Napa marginal weather was a concern that it was beyond her experience and abilities to handle the challenges of low ceilings and wind conditions. Again anxieties were the biggest problem even though her trip was successfully completed.

#### **Editor's Comment:**

One seasoned pilot in a previous forum noted: "The outcome of a flight should never be in **doubt**."

Well, I wonder, is that really relevant? The only way experience is gained and anxiety moderated is to successfully complete such trips. A pilot can only grow in experience and knowledge by overcoming **doubt** by good planning and taking on the challenge commensurate with their skill level. That means progressive and continued training, sometimes a little out of one's comfort zone. No matter what, the nature of flying will always include anxiety.

We must look out for each other----an MDPA "safety culture."

You can order any time. The Last Saturday of each month is the cutoff for orders for delivery on the following First Saturday. Delivery will be at MDPA's First Saturday breakfast at the Clubhouse.

#### **MDPA 100LL Fuel Discount at CCR**

MDPA has established a 100LL Fuel Discount Program with Sterling Aviation at CCR. This new discount began January 1, 2017 and is available to Members every day.

Members receive a MDPA 100LL Discount Card shortly after joining or renewing. Show your card to the Sterling truck driver to receive the MDPA Discount. The card is REQUIRED every time. Your card will be valid through December 31, and a new card will be sent when you renew your membership every year. The old First Saturday discount that was available only one day each month has been discontinued.
