ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

MDPA President's Comments

Maurice Gunderson announced that the next dinner meeting will be joined with the EAA as the annual crab-feed. Guests and new members were introduced (there were none). Note: The Historic Aircraft Display, when weathered out, is noticed by MDPA. For this provision to permit an exemption for showing an aircraft, the aircraft must be registered on the MDPA website for that date in advance.

Director of Airports Comments

Keith Freitas, Director of Airports, provided a quick update regarding the CTAF congestion issue at Byron Airport.

Nut Tree Airport Manager has agreed to change their frequency so that it no longer will conflict with Byron Airport CTAF. However, it will take the FCC and FAA until August of 2019 to approve and publish the new frequency.

The Airport is in final design stages of the Runway 14L/32R pavement reconstruction and overlay project. The project, pending FAA funding, is expected to start in August of 2019. The F-Row hangar project is still expected to be completed by the end of January.

The County has initiated the process to design a new general aviation terminal building/administrative office/aircraft rescue and firefighting facility. Design and environmental review have begun while construction is expected to start in 2021. Lastly, Airport staff is working with County Supervisor Karen Mitchoff to set up a meeting with Congressman Mark DeSaulnier to gain his support for a new ATCT at Buchanan Field.

Activities

Mike Harris briefed on the planned fly-out. Due to a TFR in the area over the SF Bay, it was decided to pick an alternate. The fly out of 3 aircraft was to Nut Tree.

SAFETY FORUM

Rob Squire began his flying at Concord and took his degree in aeronautical engineering at San Jose State, became an A&P and followed a career as a corporate and airline pilot, retiring from American Airlines.

As Moderator he offered his perspective on aviation mistakes in general using a concept of layers of Swiss cheese and aligning holes to pass through an aviation experience successfully. It all starts when you arise for the day facing a flight. One might ask "are you ready for this flight?" That includes yourself as well as the aircraft and readiness to face the elements.

It all starts with the pre-flight and the navigation and fuel stop planning.

Ed Note:

Rob made a remark that really puts the pre-flight into perspective----you are looking for things that can kill you. It was a coincidence that I read an article in In Flight Magazine (December '18 p. 10) "Fly Safe: Prevent Loss of Control Accidents" that strongly reflected Rob's thoughts on "Mistakes." The article expanded on the current trend on general Aviation "mistakes" ranging from Contolled Flight into Terrain (CFIT) and Loss of Control (LOC) accidents. It is worthwhile reading.

We must look out for each other --- MDPA's "safety culture".
