Tom Johnson, the aviation historian in the area, was invited to share information relative to the current Boeing 737-Max B crisis as related to historical fatality statistical trends for airlines.

Note: The Historic Aircraft Display, when weathered out, is noticed by MDPA. For this provision to permit an exemption for showing an aircraft, the aircraft must be registered on the MDPA website for that date in advance.



Director of Airports' Comments

Keith Freitas provided updates on several items:

- Airport staff wanted to thank all that were able to attend the 11th annual Tenant Appreciation lunch, the approximately 475 attendees was the largest ever.
- He provided an update regarding runway 14L/32R resurfacing project. The funding issues with the FAA have been resolved but they expect construction to start in 2020 due to the required 120 working days to complete the project.
- The new terminal building is progressing with the design consultant and includes an estimated 16,000SqFt of space to house the Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting, administration office and terminal.
- Contra Costa County Fire Protection District is conducting a site/environmental review to relocate their Fire Station #9 on Center Avenue to vacant airport property at Center Avenue and Marsh
- The FAA is conducting a Wings Program at the CCR Clubhouse today (May 4, 2019) from 1pm to 5pm. Speakers are from CCR ATCT, HWD ATCT, FSDO, CCR Airport and HWD Airport.

SAFETY FORUM

Moderator - Stuart Simms

This session was a follow on to a recent presentation by Stuart Simms in which the highlights were further discussed in detail so that the pilots could share experiences of their own as it related to something that Stuart had experienced. The newsletter write-up for that earlier presentation is reposted below since it was such a remarkable talk on safety.

Stuart Sims presented his experiences over the years in making goofy mistakes, one's that he vividly remembers. He owns a "Columbia" type aircraft. To summarize what he covered, it generally would be called having "situational awareness" experiences, the current buzz words for remaining alert to what's going on as you move from take-off to landing, especially somewhere else.

- Fuel Exhaustion
- Getting lost
- Defuel of body before flight (or during)

• Food container effects at high altitudes Thunderheads - entering and dealing with icing

He shared some words of wisdom:

- Plan for a trip early so you do not rush planning/preflight.
- If you wonder about having enough fuel, you do not have enough fuel!
- Have cash in case credit cards don't work.
- Your IQ drops progressively with the number and types of passengers you have (i.e. added stress can easily lead to more mistakes).
- Better landings come from learning from bad landings. (Need to continually challenge yourself with due respect for risk calibration.)

We must look out for each other --- MDPA's "safety culture".
